Nominee Criteria

- Graduated from a District 230 high school at least five years prior to nomination.
- Made significant contributions and demonstrated leadership and character in his/her field and to his/her community.
- Posthumous nominations are accepted.

Selection of Inductees

The District 230 Foundation Board of Directors comprise the selection committee.

Procedure for Nominations

- Nominations may be made by alumni, current or former faculty and staff, administrators, and community members of District 230.
- Nominations need to be submitted by June 15. In order to consider each nomination equitably, the attached nomination form should be completed and submitted.
- Nominations remain active for three years.
- Nominations will not be considered when: submitted by a family member of the nominee, for a current District 230 employee, or for a current District 230 Foundation Board member.

Induction

Each Spring, the District 230 Foundation hosts an annual Legacy event. Inductees will be introduced along with recognition of District 230 Foundation Grant Award Recipients. The Legacy Dinner will be held in October at Silver Lake Country Club in Orland Park, Illinois.
